Subject: Request for Comments on the draft of "The Punjab Protection of Trees Act, 2025"

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the above mentioned subject, it is informed that in compliance of the order dated 28.07.2023 passed by the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal in MA No. 48/2023 in OA No. 200/2023 (Kuldeep Singh Khaira and others Vs State of Punjab and others) and order dated 31.04.2024 in OA No. 378/2022 (Sahil Garg Vs State of Punjab and others), the Department of Forests had issued the "Tree Preservation Policy for Non-Forest Government and Public Lands – 2024" after obtaining approval of the Hon'ble Cabinet, keeping in view the regulation and management of trees standing on non-forest public lands.

2. It is further informed that, as per the order dated 29.04.2025 passed by the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal in MA No. 38/2024 in OA No.

257/2023 (Balbir Dass Vs State of Punjab), due to lack of clarity regarding the applicability of the said policy, directions have been issued to the Chief Secretary, Punjab to frame a comprehensive Act, in place of the policy.

3. Further, it is pertinent to mention that during the hearing held on 29.05.2025 in OA No. 1279/2024 (Tejaswi Minhas Vs State of Punjab), Chief Secretary, Punjab, assured the Hon'ble Tribunal that the State Government will initiate the necessary action to frame the said Act and present the required bill before the Punjab Legislative Assembly within six months. Therefore the compliance has to be made before November, 2025.

4. In compliance to above directions & Commitment, a draft of **"The Punjab Protection of Trees Act, 2025"** intended for application to non-forest urban lands of whole of Punjab has been prepared by this Department. The objective of the Act is to strengthen tree conservation efforts, enhance green cover, and ensure ecological sustainability in urban areas outside notified forest regions.

5. You are requested to kindly circulate the draft Act widely among your department's stakeholders, including affiliated institutions, local bodies, public representatives, Farmers, Industrial Groups, Resident Associations and other connected parties. Their feedback is crucial to ensure the proposed legislation is comprehensive, practical, and inclusive.

6. In this regard, we request the following from your department:

1. **Collect individual and institutional views** from stakeholders under your jurisdiction.
2. **Compile your department's collective views and specific comments** on the draft Tree Protection Act.
3. Submit your **final consolidated response in English** to this office on or before **25th July, 2025** for further action at email ID

Your timely support and response in this matter are highly appreciated to ensure a participatory and transparent policy making process.

The Punjab Protection of Trees Act, 2025
Act ____ of 2025

The Punjab Protection of Trees Act, 2025

Statement of Objects and Reasons. - With a view to maintaining green cover for ensuring ecological balance, preventing pollution of environment and conserving the soil, it is considered necessary to regulate the felling and replanting of trees in the State of Punjab.

1. Short title, extent and commencement.

- (1) This Act may be called the Punjab Protection of Trees Act, 2025.
- (2) It extends to all the urban areas of Punjab.
- (3) It shall come into force at once.

2. Act not to apply to certain areas.

This Act shall not apply to-

- (a) All the trees situated in any forest or wildlife areas as recorded in the records of Department of Forests and Wildlife Preservation hereinafter termed as Forest Department;
- (b) Trees situated in cantonments, paramilitary and defense agencies campuses and areas;
- (c) Trees situated in Lands notified under Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900.

3. Definitions.

In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the context-

- (i) **"Appellate authority"** means an authority appointed by the State Government for the purposes of this Act;
- (ii) **"Exempted area"** means areas included in the Schedule – I of this Act
- (iii) **"Exempted trees"** means tree species included in the Schedule-II of this Act
- (iv) **"Fell a tree"**, with its cognate expressions, means cutting, girdling, pollarding or damaging a tree in a way so as to cause its death/drying;
- (v) **"Tree"** means any woody plant whose branches spring from and are supported upon a trunk or body and whose trunk or body is not less than 'thirty five centimeters' in girth at the ground level;
- (vi) **"Tree Officer"** means an Executive Officer in Urban local bodies in Punjab or any other officer so notified by the State Government;
- (vii) **"Urban area"** means an area, which is included within the limits of a Nagar Council, Municipal Corporation, Notified Area Committee,

Town Area Committee, or of any Urban Development Authority/Body mentioned in the Schedule III of this Act;

- (viii) Words and expressions used in this Act and defined in the Indian Forest Act, 1927, as amended in its application to Punjab, but not defined in this Act shall have the meaning respectively assigned to them in that Act.

4. Restriction on felling and removal of trees.

Except as provided in this Act or the rules made thereunder, no person shall-

- (a) fell any tree standing on any urban area;
- (b) cut, remove or otherwise dispose of any tree other than a tree which is completely dead or has fallen without the aid of human agency in any urban area.

5. Permission to fell or remove trees.

The tree officer may, on the application of any owner or person entitled to fell a standing tree or to cut, remove or otherwise dispose of a fallen tree, after making such inquiry, as it thinks fit, grant permission to him to do so;

- a) Provided that such permission shall not be refused if the tree constitutes danger to a person or property;
- b) Provided further that such permission shall not be required for the felling of exempted trees mentioned in Schedule-II of this act in the urban areas;
- c) Provided also that in exigencies such as floods, storms, warlike situation or any other natural or manmade calamities, such immediate steps as are necessary to remove any obstruction or nuisance or to prevent any danger to public life and/or property such permission shall not be required for the felling of trees.

In the cases where permission of tree officer is not required, the concerned agency shall inform the details of felling/ removal of such trees to the tree officer within 24 hours of the same.

6. Procedure for obtaining permission to fell or remove trees.

(1) Every application under *Section 5* shall be in writing and shall be made in such manner and shall contain such particulars as may be prescribed.

(2) The Tree Officer shall give his decision in the case of an application in respect of tree felling within thirty days from the date of receipt of such application, and in the case of an application in respect of a dead or fallen tree within seven days from the date of receipt of such application..

(3) Every permission granted under this Act shall be in such form and subject to such reasonable conditions, as may be prescribed by the tree officer.

(4) If the tree officer fails to give his/ her decision within the stipulated time as allowed by sub-section (2), the permission referred to in Section 5 shall be deemed to have been granted.

(5) Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Tree Officer under sub-section (2) may make a representation within thirty days from the date of such decision, to the Appellate Authority and the decision of appellate authority on such representation shall be final.

7. Obligation to plant trees.

Every person, to whom permission has been granted under this Act to fell, cut, remove or dispose of any tree, shall be bound to plant and tend two trees in lieu of every tree cut/ felled as far as possible in the same area, from where such tree has been felled, cut, removed or disposed of by him under such permission; Provided that in case of constraint of land for such plantation or any other constraints the Tree Officer may for reasons to be recorded in writing, permit lesser number of trees to be planted, or trees to be planted in any different area, or to deposit such sum of money in the State treasury as deemed appropriate for the purpose of such plantation.

8. Implementation of directions given under Section 7.

(1) Every person who is under an obligation to plant trees under Section 7 shall comply with the same and report within three months that all the conditions as stipulated in the felling permission of Tree Officer have been complied with;

In case of failing to do so the Tree Officer may impose a fine extending upto Rupees five thousand for the first offence and upto Fifty thousand if the non-compliance continues.

9. Environmental cost (Penalty for felling or removal of trees in contravention of Section-4)

Whoever fells or causes to be felled any standing tree, or cuts, removes or otherwise disposes of any fallen tree, in contravention of the provisions of *Section 4*, or contravenes any condition of any permission granted under this Act, the tree officer shall impose environmental compensation as notified by the State Government under the rules notified under this Act and also penalty of upto Rupees ten thousand per tree.

10. Award of penalty not to interfere with other punishment.

The award of penalty under this Act shall not prevent the inflicting of any punishment to which the person affected thereby is liable under any other law.

11. Officers to be public servants.

The officers exercising powers or discharging any duties or functions under this Act shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of Section 2(28) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023.

12. Execution of order for payment of money.

Any sum, including any amount for compounding of an offence, the payment of which has been directed to be made by any person under this Act shall, without prejudice to any other mode of recovery under any law for the time being in force, be recoverable from him as an arrears of land revenue.

13. Indemnity for acts done in good faith.

No suit or proceedings shall lie against the State Government or against any person empowered to exercise power or to perform duties or discharge functions under this Act, for anything in good faith done or purporting to be done under this Act.

14. Power of State Government to exempt.

Subject to such conditions, if any, as may be imposed, the State Government may, if it is considered necessary to do so in the public interest by notification in the Official Gazette, exempt any more areas or any species of trees by amending the respective schedules from all or any of the provisions of this Act.

15. Provisions of this Act to be in addition to any other law for the time being in force.

The provisions of the Act shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any other law for the time being in force prohibiting or regulating the felling of trees.

16. Power to make rules.

The State Government may by notification make rules to carry out the purposes of this Act.

17. Repeal and savings.

The Punjab Trees Preservation Policy, 2024 is hereby repealed.
