I hope this letter finds you well.

My name is Virenpratap Singha Bhaika, a Class 12 student at Harrow School, United Kingdom. I am writing to share a short documentary film I have recently completed, which I believe could be a valuable educational resource for school students.

The 30-minute film explores the issue of human-animal conflict, which has intensified as wildlife populations grow while forest areas remain limited. This imbalance drives animals into human settlements in search of land, water, and prey.

The film draws from my personal volunteering experiences, such as in the Namib Desert, where elephants enter villages in search of water and damage wells, and in India, where tigers stray into villages of easy prey like cattle. These encounters often lead to fear, damage, and sometimes tragic outcomes.

Combining real-life footage with expert insights, the film shows how even well-meaning conservation policies can have unintended effects on nearby communities. It encourages awareness about coexistence, ecological balance, and inclusive conservation planning.

It also underlines the importance of aligning with the UN Sustainable Development Goals and the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, both of which promote biodiversity protection and peaceful coexistence with nature.

A key message of the film is the need to stay objective. There is no single right answer. Rather than assign blame, the film invites discussion and reflection on the shared responsibilities and challenges in human-wildlife relationships.
